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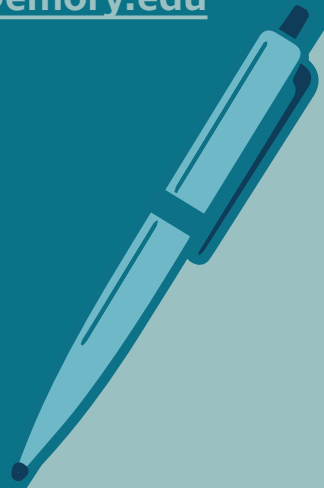

President's Address

AAWR 4th Quarter Update

It is hard to believe we are in the 4th quarter of our year! It has been a busy one for AAWR and for me.

I have been very fortunate to work with a highly engaged executive leadership team that includes Drs. Meridith Englander, Catherine Everett, Niky Farid, Jean Kunjummen and Amy Patel. Nina Lewis has provided excellent support as our Executive Director. We think it is time for us to reinvest in you, our members and many of the initiatives described below aim to do that.

I am proud to report some of my presidential initiatives. Many of these initiatives will bear fruit in 2025 and provide additional benefits and support for our members.

One of the first things we did this year was to add a monetary honorarium to our AAWR Awards. Starting in 2024, all of the AAWR Award and Research Recognition Award winners will receive \$1000 in recognition of their contributions to the fields of radiology and radiation oncology. Award winners will be recognized at our Celebration Cocktail Event on Sunday December 1st, 2024 at 6 pm. See our website for details and to purchase tickets.

We provided financial support so that our ACR Councilor (Kristin Porter) and Alternate Councilor (Elizabeth Arleo) could attend the ACR Annual Meeting without using personal funds. ACR financially supports councilors representing the state chapters to attend but does not provide support for the AAWR councilors. As an organization, AAWR has been instrumental in leading efforts at the ACR in support of paid family and parental leave and access to abortion as an essential component of healthcare.

Dr. Niky Farid has enhanced the visibility and activities of the finance committee. In addition to periodically reviewing our income/expenses and comparing them to our budget,

the committee periodically reviews our cash balances and investment profile.

The committee ensures that we have enough cash on hand for operating expenses and any excess money will be sent to our investment advisors to invest. The committee has also taken on the task of aligning our investment profile with our mission and vision, for example investing in companies that promote women and women's issues and make sure we don't invest in companies that actively subvert issues important to the AAWR. More to come on their activity in future newsletters.

We created a pediatric radiology subcommittee led by Tedy (Teresa) Victoria and Andrea Doria. This committee will provide a bridge between AAWR and the Society of Pediatric Radiology (SPR) and will engage members through programming at SPR.

Our biggest initiative this year is the creation of a member benefits committee. I asked Dr. Everett to assemble a committee tasked with enhancing member benefits. This committee is exploring adding new member-directed benefits, such as discounted executive coaching, grants that will support gender equity and DEI research, lecture series, funding for local women in radiology groups and increasing our presence and activity at other radiology and radiation oncology meetings. The AAWR Coaching Program

The AAWR is committed to sponsoring programs that promote opportunities for women to achieve personal and professional fulfillment. This commitment gave rise to the AAWR Pilot Coaching Program. Information about this program was sent to AAWR members in July, and interested members were requested to submit their name, email address, and a brief narrative about their interest in coaching. Six AAWR members were selected to participate in the pilot program. The individual coaching sessions started in August and are still ongoing. The sessions last 45-60 minutes and are provided by a trained professional coach who is a radiologist.

Dr. Mesha Martinez, a coaching program participant, shared: "Participating in the AAWR's pilot coaching scholarship program has been a transformative experience for me. Through the guidance of my coach, I found a unique opportunity to articulate my goals and concerns in a supportive environment. The simple act of having a third party listen attentively was enlightening; it allowed me to express my aspirations without judgment, especially as a woman of color in medicine.

What truly stood out was how my coach challenged me to think outside the box, encouraging me to explore perspectives I hadn't considered before. This brilliant dynamic brought clarity to my life, professional objectives, and dreams. I am emerging from the program not only with a clearer vision of my path but also with renewed confidence in my ability to pursue it."

Excerpts from other participants include:

"Through these sessions, I've gained clarity on my values and aspirations, which has been empowering in itself. This self-awareness has enabled me to make decisions that are more closely aligned with my authentic self and long-term goals. The process of articulating my thoughts and concerns to a skilled coach has helped me uncover underlying motivations and patterns, leading to more intentional and confident choices in various aspects of my life."

"Coaching has helped me realize that the path to my goals doesn't have to look like anyone else's, and it won't always be a straight climb—there will be valleys along the way. I've finally allowed myself to move at my own pace, instead of feeling pressured to keep up with others. The insights I've gained through coaching have been truly eye-opening, helping me uncover answers I might have missed otherwise. I am grateful for the experience."

"I am a mid-to-late-career radiologist in a busy academic practice facing a decision of whether to step into a leadership role in a struggling division or to begin dialing back the amount of time and energy spent at work. Both paths have their appeal and their drawbacks. Dr. Deitte has been helping me examine my priorities and build confidence in my decisions. I like knowing that she is also a radiologist and has a deep understanding of the factors at play, yet as a trained coach, she can provide objective guidance."

"Coaching has helped me improve my clarity and intention since I often can be interested in, and care about, more things than I have time to take on. One of the things I've liked about coaching compared to mentoring is instead of receiving advice from a mentor based on their perspective, the emphasis is on your personal values and motivations which may be quite different from those held by a mentor."

This successful pilot program has set the stage for continued sponsorship of the AAWR Coaching Program. We are excited to offer AAWR members the opportunity to participate in this extraordinary program that promotes personal and professional growth and fulfillment!

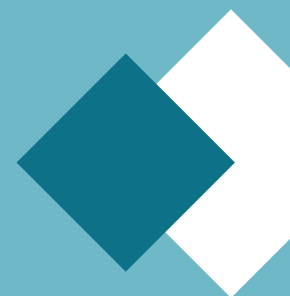

Dr. Sue S. Yom, MD, PhD, MAS, FASTRO, FAAWR, FACR is the Vice Chair of Strategic Advisory and the Irwin Mark Jacobs and Joan Klein Jacobs Distinguished Professor in the Departments of Radiation

Oncology and Otolaryngology Head and Neck Surgery at the University of California San Francisco.

She is the Editor-in-Chief of the International Journal of Radiation Oncology Biology Physics, Chair of the NRG Oncology Head and Neck Cancer Committee, and the Guidelines and Protocols Committee Co-Chair and Board Member for the Head and Neck Cancer International Group. She is also a Board Member of the RTOG Foundation and the patient advocacy organization Head and Neck Cancer Alliance. She is a Past President of the American Radium Society and was the founding Chair of the ARS Appropriate Use Criteria Committees. She is a member of the NCCN Head and Neck Cancers guidelines committee and AJCC HPV+ Oropharynx Cancer Expert Panel and is a member of the Head and Neck Cancer Resource Panel, Science Education Program Development, and Health Equity Diversity Inclusion Education Committees of the American Society of Radiation Oncology.

At UCSF, she serves as Co-Chair of the Oral Head and Neck Site Committee, Contact PI for NRG Oncology, and Full Member in Molecular Oncology for the Helen Diller Family Comprehensive Cancer Center. She holds research grants from NIH, industry, and foundations and has been author or co-author on over 250 publications in the medical literature. She has served on expert panels and scientific organizing committees for numerous professional societies.

Alice Ettinger Distinguished Achievement Award



Jacqueline A. Bello, MD, FACR

Jacqueline A. Bello, MD, FACR, is Director of Neuroradiology at Montefiore and Professor of Radiology and Neurosurgery at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine.

Dr. Bello received her Doctor of Medicine in 1980 from Columbia University's College of Physicians and Surgeons, completed an internship at Mary Imogene Bassett Hospital, followed by a residency in Diagnostic Radiology at Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center in 1984 and a fellowship in Neuroradiology at Columbia's Neurological Institute in 1986. She is board-certified by the American Board of Radiology, with a CAQ in Neuroradiology. Her focus is on adult and pediatric neuroradiology, medical education, quality and safety, and healthcare policy, with work products published in many journals, abstracts, exhibits, and textbooks, and shared in invited lectures and presentations nationally and internationally.

A Columbia University Alumni Gold Medallist, Dr. Bello has been awarded fellowships by the NY Academy of Medicine and the American College of Radiology. She is a past president of the NY Roentgen Society, and received their Distinguished Radiologist Award in 2016. She has also served as president of the NY State Radiological Society, the AMA Foundation, and is a former chair of the AMA Council on Medical Education. She represents the ASNR in the AMA House of Delegates, served as ASNR President 2017-2018, and received the ASNR Gold Medal in 2024. Dr. Bello chaired the Commission on Q&S on the ACR Board of Chancellors and served as Chair of the ACR Board of Chancellors from 2022-2024. She will receive the ACR's Gold Medal in May, 2025.

Marie Skłodowska-Curie Award



Priscilla Slanetz, MD

A graduate of the Division of Health Sciences and Technology at Harvard Medical School, Dr. Slanetz is currently Professor of Radiology at Boston University Chobanian and Avedisian School of Medicine.

As a practicing breast radiologist at Boston Medical Center, she provides breast care to the most vulnerable patients in the city as part of a multidisciplinary team. Her clinical research interests lie in healthcare disparities, evaluation of imaging technologies in breast cancer detection, and artificial intelligence. Her educational interests focus on curricular development and assessment. To date, she has over 270 publications and has given over 130 regional and national presentations. She currently serves on the Editorial Executive Committee of Academic Radiology, co-edits the Civil Discourse column for the Journal of the American College of Radiology, and is a distinguished reviewer for Radiology, American Journal of Roentgenology, Journal of the American College of Radiology, and Journal of Breast Imaging. As Vice Chair of Academic Affairs in the Department of Radiology at Boston Medical Center, she oversees faculty development and faculty promotions in the Department of Radiology. She also serves as Associate Program Director for the Diagnostic Radiology residency and Section Chief of Breast Imaging. Nationally, Dr. Slanetz is Immediate Past President of the Association of Academic Radiology (formerly AUR), Past President of the Massachusetts Radiological Society, Past President of the New England Roentgen Ray Society, and current Chair of the Commission on Publications and Lifelong Learning (CoPLL) for the American College of Radiology. She is a Fellow of the American College of Radiology, Society of Breast Imaging, American Association for Women Radiologists, and Association of University Radiologists.

Throughout her career, Dr. Slanetz has mentored and sponsored students, trainees, and peers. Many of her mentees have gone on to make substantial contributions to the field of radiology through scholarship, leadership, and advocacy. She is responsible for co-founding the New England Women in Radiology Invited Lectureship Program which provides early career women the opportunity to give a named lecture at a New England participating institution.

She also co-founded the Radiology Career Advancement Lectureship Program (RCALP; now renamed ECLEP) for the Association of Academic Radiology that offers early and mid-career faculty the opportunity to give a national presentation while also receiving peer feedback on their teaching skills. With a longstanding commitment to inclusion, Dr. Slanetz has made it her mission to break down barriers thereby empowering future generation of women radiologists to excel and make meaningful contributions to our field.

Member-in-Training Awards for Outstanding ASTRO Presentation



Agnes Ewongwo, MD

Dr. Agnes Ewongwo is a radiation oncology resident at Stanford University. She holds a bachelor's degree in physiology and biochemistry from the University of Arizona and earned her MD/MPH from the University of Arizona College of Medicine-Phoenix. Dr. Ewongwo's research focuses on global health implementation, health disparities, and cancer care, including improving radiotherapy access in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs) through collaborations with Rad-Aid. She has also led efforts to implement audiovisual technology in Sub-Saharan Africa to reduce the need for anesthesia in pediatric patients undergoing radiotherapy.

Her clinical research interests span gynecologic cancers, sarcomas, and circulating tumor DNA analysis. In addition to her research, Dr. Ewongwo is committed to mentoring medical and pre-medical students, fostering the growth of future healthcare professionals. She is a passionate advocate for health equity, with a focus on reducing disparities in cancer care, especially in underserved regions.

Next year, she will begin a faculty position at UT Southwestern Medical Center, specializing in gynecologic malignancies. In her free time, Dr. Ewongwo enjoys hiking, trying new restaurants, collecting hats from her travels, and following basketball, football, and political news.

Melissa Hosseiny, MD

Dr. Melina Hosseiny is a Clinician-Scientist Diagnostic Radiology resident at the University of California, San Diego (UCSD), where she is involved in numerous projects at the intersection of artificial

intelligence and medical imaging. She serves as the principal investigator on a prestigious \$50K RSNA Resident Grant award focusing on deep learning. Dr. Hosseiny has been honored with multiple awards and scholarships from renowned international scientific meetings, including the 2024 ARRS President's Award, 2024 SABI 3 Pearls First Place Award, 2023 RSNA Research Resident Award, 2023 Applied Radiology Award, NASCI 2023 Young Investigator Award, SABI 2023 Cum Laude Award, and SAR 2019-2020 Research Scholarship Awards.

She has authored more than 30 peer-reviewed papers, delivered over 30 scientific presentations at national and international conferences, and her work has garnered approximately 1,500 scientific citations. Dr. Hosseiny stands out as one of the first radiology trainees to actively participate in the editorial boards of leading journals in the field, including RadioGraphics and JACR."

Beyond her research endeavors, Dr. Hosseiny holds several leadership roles within the radiology community. She currently serves as the Chair of the Society of Advanced Body Imaging Early Career Committee (SABI-ECC), the Education Chair of the R4SF organization, and a member of the LI-RADS Steering Committee, and SAR-ETC on AI Committee. She has been a member of the American Association for Women Radiologists (AAWR) for five years and has served on the AAWR Social Media Committee for three years. She actively participates in AAWR meetings, including the UCSD AAWR chapter. Dr. Hosseiny is passionate about enhancing medical imaging with AI, advancing medical education, promoting diversity and inclusion, and advocating for increased representation of minorities. Inspired by her mentors at UCSD and beyond, she is committed to advancing her career in academic radiology.

Dr. Hosseiny is driven by a personal mission to make a lasting, positive impact in the world, pave the way for future generations, and advocate for increased representation of minorities.

Chelsea Schmitt is an R4 resident at Mallinckrodt Institute of Radiology in the combined nuclear medicine/diagnostic radiology program where she serves as chief resident of both diagnostic radiology and nuclear

medicine. She will be remaining at MIR to complete a fellowship in Advanced Abdominal Imaging this upcoming year. Chelsea is an active member of the organized radiology community, currently serving as vice-chair/chair-elect of the ACR RFS, a member of the Missouri Radiological Society RFS Executive Committee and a member of the RSNA RFC.

Since joining in 2018, Chelsea has been an engaged member of AAWR. She has served on the Member in Training Committee since 2020, as a member of both the Webinar and Medical Student subcommittees. Catherine Everett, MD

Dr. Catherine Everett is a summa cum laude graduate of Duke University with a degree in mathematics, and received her MD degree at the University Of North Carolina School Of Medicine. She finished her residency and

fellowship at UNC, and entered private practice at Coastal Radiology in New Bern, NC where she is still working 42 years later.

She is a long term managing partner of the practice, and served as President for many years. Catherine served on the executive committee of the medical staff at Carolina East Medical Center for 16 consecutive years, as both chair of the department of imaging, and an at-large member. She was the first, and only, female chief of staff.

In 2010, Catherine received an MBA from the Yale School of Management. Merideth Englander, MD

Dr. Meridith Englander is an interventional radiologist in the Albany, NY. She graduated from Smith College and received her medical degree from Albany Medical College, where she also completed her radiology residency. Her

fellowship in Vascular and Interventional Radiology was completed at Massachusetts General Hospital. Although currently working in a non-clinical role as a medical director at a regional managed health care plan, she maintains her academic credentials at Albany Medical College, where she continues to lecture and mentor residents.

Dr. Englander is a vocal advocate for gender equity issues in medicine and has published widely on this topic. She was the inaugural chair of the Women in Interventional Radiology section of the Society of Interventional Radiology (SIR) and was the 2020 recipient of the SIR Women in Interventional Radiology Champion Award. She currently serves as the Chair of the Data and Benchmarking Committee of the Diversity and Inclusion Advisory Group at the SIR.

Dr. Englander is also a strong advocate for Interventional Radiology, serving as a past chair of the SIR Government Affairs Committee. She is an SIR delegate to the AMA, where she is the immediate past-Chair of the Specialty and Service Society, the largest caucus of specialty medical societies at the AMA. She is also Councilor for the SIR to the American College of Radiology. At the ACR, she serves on the Commission on Interventional and Cardiovascular Imaging and is a member of the Committee for Women.

Dr. Englander has served as an oral examiner for the American Board of Radiology and has been a member of the AAWR Fellowship Selection Committee.
