Practice/National Leadership Activities

- In 2016, my practice joined Radiology Partners, a national radiology group. I have continued in a leadership role, serving on two national support boards and on the presidents' council.
- Locally, I have served at least 16 years as a member of the Executive Committee of our flagship hospital, Carolina East Regional Medical Center. I served as Chief of Staff in 1999-2001, still the only woman to do so. I serve on the Tryon Palace Commission (appointed by the governor of NC), the New Bern Chapter of the North Carolina Symphony Board, and on the board of First Citizens Bank. I am a member of the Order of the Long Leaf Pine, an honor bestowed by the governor for commitment and service to North Carolina.
- I have had many, many roles in national radiology organizations. I have served as state president of the NC radiological society, on the ACR steering committee, as chair of the Economics Committee of the Commission on General, Small, Emergency, Rural (GSER) practices, chair of the steering committee of SRS (Senior and/or Retired Section), and on the board of the AAWR as PP representative. I achieved fellowship in ACR in 2015.
- I was a summa cum laude graduate of Duke University, AOA graduate of UNC school of medicine, and did my residency and fellowship at UNC hospitals. Mid-career, I obtained my MBA at Yale School of Management.
- I am founder and co-owner of Eidetico, a radiology company that wrote a report library used by our practice for structured reporting.

Why did you decide to join the private practice?

I made my practice choice based on location...I wanted to live on the water. New Bern is a delightful coastal town on 2 rivers within 30 minutes by car to the ocean, and 1 hour by boat. I have a 10 minute drive to work, so I can be on my dock by 515 everyday to water ski, wakeboard, paddle board, kayak...or just drink a glass of wine and watch the porpoises, jumping mullet, seagulls, osprey, eagles.....

I have five children, one born while I was a fellow at UNC (first in the program), and four while in private practice. I continued to work full-time through all pregnancies, with two weeks maternity leave in PP. That was the norm then. Thank goodness it is so much better now...and getting even better.
